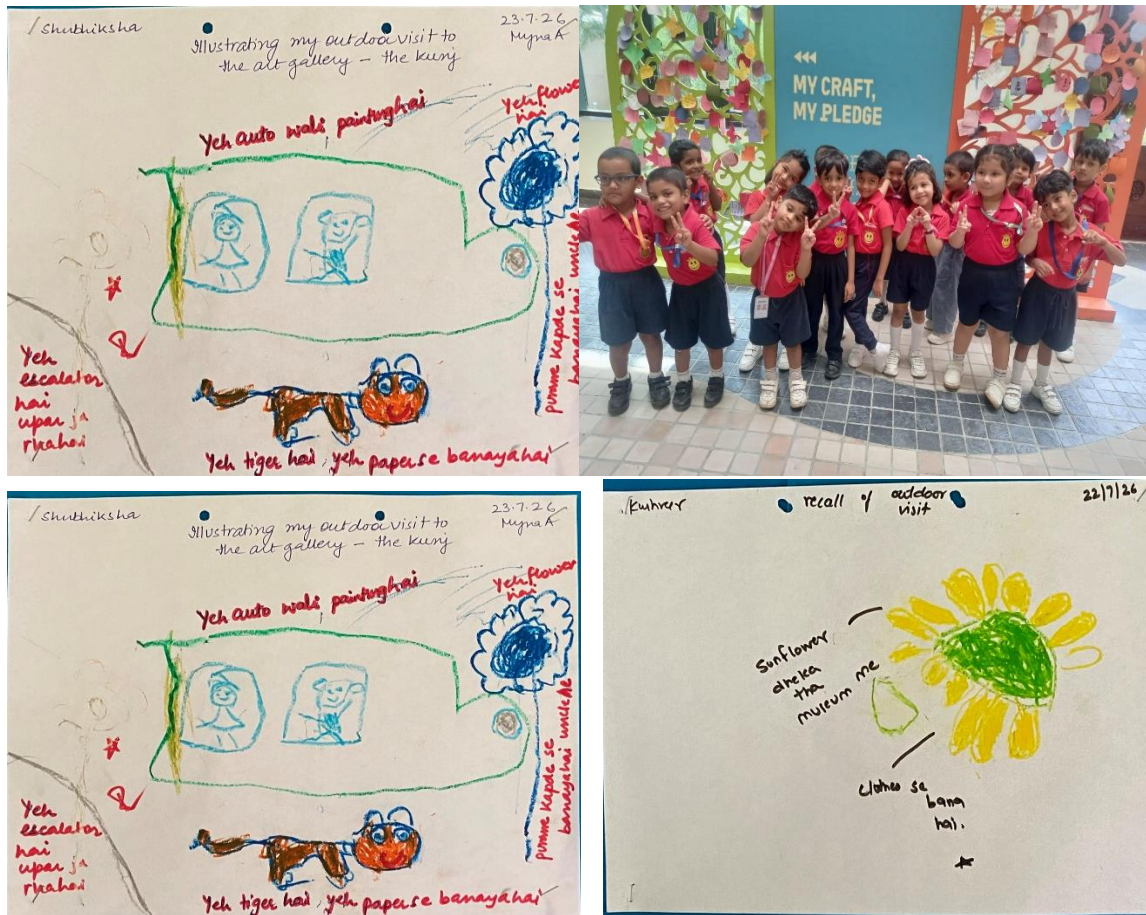
After exploring the gallery, the children expressed their creativity by drawing and colouring their favourite artwork. It was wonderful to see their enthusiasm and imagination.
